

BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
Monday, January 10, 2000

The Butler County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Commission Chairman, Linsey Cutsinger. Present were Commissioner Neal Parrish, County Administrator, Jay Newton and Clerk's Secretary, Tindel Jennison. Commissioner Doll was absent due to illness.

KDOT COMMUNICATION TOWER

Commissioner Cutsinger moved to authorize County Counselor, Norman Manley to contact Kansas Department of Transportation Attorney, Brad Stout to inform him that the Board is conducting further research regarding the proposed site of the 480-foot Communications Tower and that the Board has not made a determination that KDOT is exempt and will not make such a determination until such time that the Board is satisfied that it is the only site. Commissioner Parrish seconded the motion that carried 2-0.

Commissioner Cutsinger moved to authorize the County Administrator to contact a Communications Consultant to see if the proposed site for the KDOT communications tower is the only location in Butler County that is suitable for the tower. Commissioner Parrish seconded the motion that carried 2-0.

FINANCIAL ADVISOR BIDS

Commissioner Parrish moved to authorize the County Administrator to solicit bids from various firms for a financial advisor for Butler County in regards to pending Bond issues for the new Judicial Building and Jail. Commissioner Cutsinger seconded the motion that carried 2-0.

COUNTY VOUCHER APPROVAL

Commissioner Cutsinger moved to approve County Vouchers dated January 10, 2000 totaling \$153,760.21 (for the year 1999). Commissioner Parrish seconded the motion that carried 2-0.
