

BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Butler County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Commission Chairman, Randy Doll. Present were Commissioners Neal Parrish and Linsey Cutsinger along with Clerk's Secretary, Tindel Jennison.

COUNTY VOUCHER APPROVAL

Commissioner Doll moved to approve County Vouchers totaling \$771,170.31 dated July 10, 2000. Commissioner Cutsinger seconded the motion that carried 3-0.

TRAFFIC PAINT BID

Commissioner Parrish moved to accept the bid from Sherwin Williams in the amount of \$24,613.73 for traffic paint and \$4,708.00 for reflective paint to be paid out of Road and Bridge. Commissioner Cutsinger seconded the motion that carried 3-0.
