ITEM #1 – TAPE LIBRARY BACKUP SOLUTION - BID OPENING

Lew Harter, Director of Information Technology (IT), and Kevin Norman, IT, came before the Board to receive and open sealed bids for the purchase of a tape library backup solution for the IT Department. This solution is intended to enhance the County's current backup strategy and to strengthen data security measures by providing a backup medium that allows physical separation from the network with greater retention. It was proposed the name of the vendor be read along with the bid price. Staff recommended all bids received and accepted by the County Commission be tabulated and evaluated by staff and a recommendation for purchase be returned at a later time. The bid tabulations are as follows:
